On the day before the Reunion last year Fred celebrated his 100th birthday in great style – there were greetings from the Queen, the Secretary of State and many others including the Old Paludians and the School. IN MEMORIAM

Fred Deeks (1931-36). Friendships from schooldays endure for a lifetime and such a friend Len Thorne (1934-36) recalls: I found myself in Form 4a and sitting next to Freddie – there started a friendship which stood the test of time for over 65 years and only ended with his death last September. With Freddie's folks at the Post Office in Burnham Beeches in those days, we spent many happy hours roaming through the woods. Although he passed exams which would have taken him on to University, circumstances did not permit so Freddie became a laboratory technician at Hanovia then moved to High Duty Alloys who were, by then, engaged in important war work keeping our fighters and bombers in the air. The war over, Freddie married Dot and as the years went by the family grew (3 sons and now 4 grandchildren) – their Golden Wedding was celebrated in May, 1996 when they were surrounded by loving family and friends. Whenever we met in later years, we would enjoy playing crib whilst the womenfolk chatted – I never won!. Freddie was outstandingly intelligent but always quiet and retiring, he was a kind and modest man, a very good friend and a very real gentleman in all senses of the word. Freddie will be sadly missed and will never be replaced.

Ernest Evans‡ (1931-36). Just a few days after Ernie was in touch with us sending his good wishes, we heard the tragic news he had died on 4th February. He wrote very amusing reminiscences of his days at the old Secondary School for the book and **John Gunn** (1931-36) writes about their lifetime friendship: We both started at Slough Secondary in September 1931 – that first day a Book of Common Prayer was on each desk, John looked at Ernie, pointed to the instruction "a man may not marry his grandmother" and said, "Who would want to". At this, both boys giggled, they became friends and continued to giggle through the years. After service in the RAF during WWII Ernie worked in the Air Ministry and distinguished himself by becoming a barrister by studying part-time. His talent to amuse was legendary and his repertoire included sketches based on an interest in Olde-Time Music-Hall. After being a widower for some time, he married again and life was good. He was looking forward to a trip to Australia when the news of his totally unexpected death shocked everyone. We extend our sincere condolences to Ernie's wife and all the family.

Thomas Paxton (1935-39). Sadly, Tom also died last year. He had been a pilot in the RAF during the war after which most of his working life was spent in the world of insurance, namely Sun Alliance Co. There were three sons, Michael (Old Paludian himself), Christopher and Peter and he lived in Worthing with his second wife. We send our sympathy to Michael and all the family.

Cedric Eustance (1938-42). His sister **Audrey Fenn** (1938-40) writes: Cedric died of cancer at the age of 68. A keen member of the CCF, he was commissioned in the Gordon Highlanders, serving during the war in Britain and the Far East. After the war, most of his career was spent with BAPCO, an oil company in Bahrain, followed by assignments all over the world with other oil companies. Sadly missed by family and friends

Barbara Holmes (Mickleburgh 1938-45). Barbara died last year and her funeral was attended by a number of Old Paludians. It was a lovely service with wonderful music and the duet from the 'Pearl Fishers' was especially moving.

Natalie D'Albon (1939-42). Natalie will be remembered by many pupils who were at SHS in the late 1930's. She always had a great sense of humour and **Daphne Botting** (May 1936-42) remembers her as a lively girl with a penchant for the mischievous. On leaving school she went into nursing and later hoped to study medicine (her late father had been a GP). Sadly she contracted TB and spent 2 years in a Swiss sanatorium. In her thirties she opened the first Charity shop in Kensington selling items made by the disabled. The Duchess of Gloucester visited several times and then arranged for Natalie to take a selection of her items to Buckingham Palace. She opened a residential home for children in Kew, later re-locating to South Croydon. Many of 'her' children kept in touch long after they had moved on, and indeed, a number of them attended her funeral. She was secretary to the Girl Guide Association in London - another interest - and she made a collection of Guide uniforms through the years. Natalie will be sadly missed.

1940s

IN MEMORIAM

Denis James (c.1944-51). Denis died last October and **Barry Serjent** (1943-49) remembers him from schooldays when they were both 'pillars' of the SGS Dramatic Society. Just over 50 years ago they were both in a production of "Arsenic and Old Lace" brought to mind vividly as Barry has been appearing in that very play at his little theatre in Wembley and had hoped Denis might come to see him. Denis became a schoolmaster and was very involved in Slough, becoming a councillor and later deputy Mayor. His funeral was attended by many friends and civic dignitaries – his work for the people of Slough will be long remembered.

Derek Webb (1948-53). Sadly passed away last September aged 62 years after a long and difficult illness. He was passionately fond of all sport but will be best remembered as a goalkeeper and administrator with the Old Pals Hockey Club in the 1960's. 1970s


