****IN MEMORIAM****

Alfred Sands (1925-31). It was a great shock to learn of the very sudden death of **Alfred** on 12 January at the great age of 86. He had lived in Burnham the whole of his life; after leaving Slough Secondary School he became a director of the family motor engineering business, W J Sands, which his father had founded and where he remained until retirement. He supported many local organisations and was a founder member of the Rotary Club of Burnham – in recognition of his service, he was made a Paul Harris Fellow which is the Rotary Club's highest honour. With his brother Bob, he was the longest serving member of the United Reform Church in Burnham. In his early days Alfred played both football and cricket for the village. A much respected, kind and gentle man who will be sorely missed. We extend our heartfelt condolences to Winnie and his family.

Harold Waite (1926-32). It was very sad to hear that **Harold Waite** had died shortly after last year's Reunion, which he had been able to attend and spend a happy afternoon with the Old Pals. He will be remembered as a kindly, humorous, highly principled man with many interests including music and Morris dancing. ****IN MEMORIAM****

Vij Burgess (1933-38). Vij, as she was known to her closest friends, was a charismatic person who led a most varied and interesting life. On leaving school she became a civil servant in London and was re-located to Southport during the War. She returned from there in 1941 to help her mother and sisters run the family garage when her father became ill; she then became a Land Girl subsequently acting as a Milk Recorder. In

1945 Vij was able to go to Moulton College where she studied agriculture. With a friend, Tucker, she took over the running of a farm in Denham in 1948 and started a Young Farmer's Club in Stoke Poges. By the late 1950's she moved to London again fulfilling her dream of being a journalist working for various publications including the Farmers' Weekly. In the mid 1960's she travelled for a year before training to be a teacher. After semi-retiring, Vij undertook private tuition making a lasting impression on her students; more travelling followed and in 1996 she finally moved, with a friend, to Petersfield to be near Tucker and **Mary Wood** née Tarrant who was from Stoke Poges. Vij died in November just short of her 79th birthday. She never lost her sense of humour and her friend **Gail** says of her "...a great inspirer and encourager of young people. She made them believe in themselves and fostered their ambitions". Throughout her life, Vij was a most generous friend of the Old Paludians.

Olive Ferguson (Thomas 1937-45). Olive was a great friend of the Old Paludians and we greatly appreciated her generosity. It is always sad to mark the passing of a friend and two of her school friends have penned the following: Olive died very suddenly just before Christmas. She began at the old High School in 1937 when it was still in William Street and went to Twinches Lane in 1939 where she later became Deputy Head Girl. In 1945 she studied at University College in London developing her great flair for languages – she spoke French, German, Russian, Norwegian and Spanish. Her first teaching post was in Leicester then she moved to Haberdashers' Aske's and lived in Charlton. Olive was devoted to the Old Paludians attending the Reunions whenever possible and she came to 'our' frequent form lunches. Together with **Evelyn Robinson** we had all been friends for over 60 years. In retirement she pursued her love of photography and travelled widely. In addition she cared for elderly neighbours and relatives. She will be much missed by her husband Edward and her many friends. **Ivy Harris** (Cook) and **Thelma Kyte** (Roberts).

Gwen adds: One of Olive's last projects, at the request of a friend, was to translate some captions under a series of sketches done by a German Lieutenant in Belgium in 1915-16. This was no easy task as it was all in Gothic script. Later the friend re-appeared with the same Officer's diary, full of abbreviations and written in the trenches. This was for a Museum in Ypres where there is an exhibition called "Unquiet Graves". Olive received a letter of thanks from the Curator. We send our condolences to family and friends.

In losing Vij and Olive, the Old Paludians and Slough Grammar School have lost not only two super ladies but two benefactors. In a quiet, indeed anonymous way, they both gave many, more than generous, donations which helped to build up the funds of the Old Pals, who were able in turn to help the School. We shall remember them with affection and gratitude.

Gerald F Cullimore and **Alan B Cullimore**. Both pupils in the 1930's and early 1940's: sadly news has reached us of Gerald's death in October last year, aged 74, and also that of Alan; he died in Toronto in January aged 78.
