****IN MEMORIAM****

Edward Hartley MBE (1920-26). Edward, always known as Ned, sadly died on 22 January having suffered the tragic loss of his daughter **Anna** only weeks before. He was born in Stoke Poges and lived in the village for all of his life. He married Dorothy Burfoot of Eton Wick, (who predeceased him in January 2001) they had four children, Anna, Tessa, Edwin and Philippa. On leaving Slough Secondary School he entered the family building business, William Hartley and Sons of Wexham, and continued working there into his 70's. He helped with the building of the Old Paludians Limited Clubhouse at Taplow. He was awarded his MBE for services to the local community of Stoke Poges, where he had served as a Parish Councillor, a warden at St Giles' Church, and as a trustee of local charities.

Jean Bailey (Sands 1927-33). Jean died shortly before the 2001 Reunion. She had not been in good health after the death of her brother Alfred in January 2001. It was very sad for the Sands family to lose two much loved relatives in such a short time and we send our sympathy to Bob, Molly, Margaret and their respective families.

Ron Bruce (1929-34). It is sad to report the death, after a long period of ill-health, of Ron Bruce aged 83. A staunch supporter of the Old Pals and the Cricket Club in particular. ****IN MEMORIAM****

Esmé Holloway (Berendt 1930-33). News has reached us of the sad death of Esmé on 31 July last year. Her husband Vic has been kind enough to tell us a little of their life together. He was with REME in Palestine in 1945 when he met Esmé who was with the Red Cross, working as a physiotherapist in a hospital in Haifa. Their eyes met across a crowded room at a Mess party and they were married in 1946 – strictly against the rules – and had a flat on Mount Carmel. Also that year they had a holiday in Cyprus thereby beginning a love of that island and to which they returned later. In was in 1947 that Victor and Esmé returned to UK, back to

rationing, floods and general 'awfulness'. He took a job in Yorkshire for 6 months but they stayed 17 years; after several moves and his first retirement, Vic took a job which meant them spending time in South Africa. They loved travelling and saw many places before finally retiring to Devon. Two daughters and five grown-up grandchildren (4 boys, one girl) completed the family. *We send our sympathy and good wishes to all the family and my especial thanks to Victor who, since I mislaid his first notes by putting them away safely, was patient enough to recall his memories a second time - and yes, I found them shortly afterwards!! - Ed.*

John Dean (1930-36). John died on 21 March 2001. We had heard from him in February when he sent his good wishes to all of us. He had no immediate family and before retirement had been a bank manager with NatWest Bank. John was a well-loved member of the Old Paludians Masonic Lodge.

Alan Blay (1931-36). Alan died in June 2001 – he started his career as a compositor with Slough Newspapers Ltd, became foreman at the Slough Observer and later joined the Board of Directors. His wife, Mollie, had been secretary to Mrs Boul's husband at Slough and Eton School. Those present at School functions during the 1990's remember with pleasure the lovely singing of Emma Sparrow, Emma and Alan's grand-daughter. Our condolences were sent to Mollie and family.

Norah Littlehales (1931-37). Norah died on 26 January aged 81 in Addenbrookes Hospital, Cambridge. She was a former Headteacher, supporter of amateur dramatics and a dedicated Churchgoer. Norah was born in Farnham Royal and lived for some years in the Three Tuns PH where her father was the Licensee and she enjoyed guiding with the St Mary's Guides in Slough. After qualifying at the Rachel McMillan Training College, Norah took up several teaching posts before becoming Headteacher of the Cherry Hinton Hall Nursery School where she taught for 32 years before retiring in 1981. She had lived in Cambridge for over 50 years and will be much missed, no more so than by **Marjorie Cruse** who penned these memories of her old schoolfriend.

Elna Cook (McKenzie 1932-38). **Joan Clack (Waite)** writes: "Elna was with me and **Barbara** (see below) all through our lives both at the secondary School and the High School. When we left, Elna stayed in Slough and then moved to Wilton on her marriage. Although I was in Yorkshire, we met through the years especially after the families had grown up. We would meet up, go to a Show in London and generally do what girls do (*I hope you mean gossip - Ed!*) After her husband's death she moved to Marlow near her daughter and we began holidaying together in Europe. I am involved with the Red Cross and Elna, too, was involved looking after the medical loan department right up to her death on New Year's Eve 1999. She had trained as a Librarian and on my visits south in those early days, I sometimes joined her taking books to the housebound. One of the elderly ladies knew my home town of Harrogate and our chattering threw all the schedules out of the window. I hope there are still some of 'the girls' out there who remember her and her great sense of fun. I miss a wonderful friend."

Barbara Head (Mines 1932-38). Sadly Barbara died on 18 December after 56 years of marriage. She led a full and very happy life, joining the Civil Service on leaving School. She was transferred to the War Office at the outbreak of the war where she met Rob and they married in 1945. After their children, Stephen and Jacqueline, had grown up, she embarked on a new career. Becoming a part-time Science Laboratory Technician, she decided to go further and became qualified to degree standard – in fact she became one of the most highly qualified technicians in that field in Hertfordshire. Retirement in 1980 meant a change of direction and Barbara joined the WI. She served as Secretary for 5 years and as President for 4 years at her local Institute. Our deepest sympathies go to her husband, Rob, and to Stephen and Jacqueline and their families.

John W Griffith (1936-42). **Norman Ward** recalls his memories of John: "He was a new boy at the new school in 1936, leaving in 1942 and he joined the Navy serving until 1946. Returning to the area he reunited with the Old Paludians and was part of the group who re-formed the Cricket Club in 1947. A formidable left-handed batsman and competent wicket keeper, taking the captaincy for two spells, he played for some 21 years. During the latter part of this time he became Chairman of Old Paludians Ltd after John Collin resigned. In 1968 he retired from Flexello and with his wife Joan moved to Pagham in Sussex. Later, they moved to Stamford, Lincs, to be near their son and his family. It was here that he died in February 2001."

George Borwell (1937-43). We have only recently learned that George died on 7 June 2000. His wife Joan has many happy memories of the Dances they attended together. *Our condolences to Joan and family - Ed.*

Kathleen Robinson (1939-45). Kathleen sadly died in September 2001 – her funeral and Thanksgiving Service were attended by **Joyce Haggerty** (Newstead 1939-45) who remembers her friend thus: "This was a lovely service, a celebration of Kathleen's life and homegoing which she had arranged herself. The little St Leonard's Church at Richings Park was full and four Old Paludians were present, all finding it hard to believe

that she had gone and knowing how much she will be missed. Kathleen was much involved in the Church and village life – she lived all her life in the house where she was born. Her parents had moved there in the early 1920's when Richings Park Estate was newly built. St Leonard's was 'her' Church, as a child in the Sunday School and later as a teacher. She started the Brownie Group and became Brown Owl. She loved music, sang in the choir at St Leonard's and St Peter's Churches and was a founder member of the Richings Park Choral Society in 1943, later becoming its treasurer. She was also involved with several charities. Kathleen was a lovely, gentle person and I feel sad to have lost such a dear friend. JH"

Barbara Bignell (Hall) 1939-47. Many of you will remember Barbara who died last Autumn. Her husband, Alan, was kind enough to give these notes to **David Jewell** for inclusion in the Newsletter. From the High School Barbara went to Whitelands College to train as a teacher. Then to Lea Infants School, followed by a Child Development Course at London University, after which she returned to one of the Lea Schools as Deputy Head. In 1957 she became Lecturer at City of Birmingham Training College and studied for a degree in Sociology at the University of London. By 1962, Barbara was a Lecturer and eventually Head of Department of Sociology at Borough Road College, Isleworth where one of her students was her future husband Alan. She took early retirement in 1981 so Alan, himself a Head of Department in Ealing, could study for ordination. In 1990 she was appointed a governor of St Mary's C of E School, sometimes as Chairman, as well as working as a voluntary helper there. Over the years their home has been a refuge for many people who needed support. *I am sure all those who remember Barbara send condolences to Alan and take pride in having known such a wonderfully caring lady – Ed.*
